As used in this subsection, "HIV/AIDS" means Human Immunodeficiency 8 9 Virus/Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome." 10 **SECTION 1.(b)** G.S. 115C-81(e1)(3), (4), and (5) read as rewritten: The State Board of Education shall develop objectives for instruction 11 "(3) 12 in the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases, including Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) virus infection, HIV/AIDS, that 13 14 includes include emphasis on the importance of parental involvement, 15 abstinence from sex until marriage, and avoiding intravenous drug use. Any program developed under this subdivision shall present 16 17 techniques and strategies to deal with peer pressure and to offer 18 positive reinforcement and shall teach reasons, skills, and strategies for remaining or becoming abstinent from sexual activity; for appropriate 19 20 grade levels and classes, shall teach that abstinence from sexual 21 activity until marriage is the only certain means of avoiding out-of-wedlock pregnancy, most sexually transmitted diseases, and 22 23 other associated health and emotional problems, and that a mutually 24 faithful monogamous heterosexual relationship in the context of marriage is the best lifelong means of avoiding diseases transmitted by 25 sexual contact, including Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome 26 (AIDS); HIV/AIDS, and shall teach the positive benefits of abstinence 27 until marriage and the risks of premarital sexual activity. Any 28 29 instruction concerning the causes of sexually transmitted diseases, including Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), in cases 30 where homosexual acts are a significant means of transmission, shall 31 32 include the current legal status of those acts. The State Board of Education shall evaluate abstinence until marriage 33 (4) curricula and their learning materials and shall develop and maintain a 34 35 recommended list of one or more approved abstinence until marriage curricula. The State Board may develop an abstinence until marriage 36
 - curricula and their learning materials and shall develop and maintain a recommended list of one or more approved abstinence until marriage curricula. The State Board may develop an abstinence until marriage program to include on the recommended list. The State Board of Education shall not select or develop a program for inclusion on the recommended list that does not include the positive benefits of abstinence until marriage and the risks of premarital sexual activity as the primary focus. The State Board shall include on the recommended list only programs that include, in appropriate grades and classes, instruction that:

Teaches that abstinence from sexual activity is the only certain 8 means of avoiding out-of-wedlock pregnancy, most sexually 9 transmitted diseases, including Acquired Immune Deficiency 10 Syndrome (AIDS), HIV/AIDS, and other associated health and emotional problems; 11 12 Teaches that a mutually faithful monogamous heterosexual e. relationship in the context of marriage is the best lifelong means 13 14 of avoiding sexually transmitted diseases, including Acquired 15 Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS); HIV/AIDS; Teaches the positive benefits of abstinence until marriage and 16 f. 17 the risks of premarital sexual activity; 18 Provides opportunities that allow for interaction between the g. parent or legal guardian and the student; and 19 20 factually accurate biological h. **Provides** pathological 21 information that is related to the human reproductive 22 system.system; and 23 Teaches how alcohol and drug use lower inhibitions, which <u>i.</u> 24 may lead to risky sexual behavior. The State Board of Education shall make available to all local school 25 (5) administrative units for review by the parents and legal guardians of 26 students enrolled at that unit any State-developed objectives for 27 instruction, any approved textbooks, the list of reviewed materials, and 28 29 any other State-developed or approved materials that pertain to or are intended to impart information or promote discussion or understanding 30 in regard to the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases, including 31 32 Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), HIV/AIDS, to the avoidance of out-of-wedlock pregnancy, or to the abstinence until 33 marriage curriculum. The review period shall extend for at least 60 34 35 days before use." **SECTION 1.(c)** G.S. 115C-81(e1)(7) and (8) read as rewritten: 36 Each school year, before students may participate in any portion of (i) 37 "(7)a program that pertains to or is intended to impart information or 38 39 promote discussion or understanding in regard to the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases, including Acquired Immune Deficiency 40 Syndrome (AIDS), HIV/AIDS, or to the avoidance of out-of-wedlock 41 42 pregnancy, (ii) an abstinence until marriage program, or (iii) a comprehensive sex education program, whether developed by the State 43

or by the local board of education, the parents and legal guardians of

those students shall be given an opportunity to review the objectives 1 2 and materials. Local boards of education shall adopt policies to 3 provide opportunities either for parents and legal guardians to consent or for parents and legal guardians to withhold their consent to the 4 5 students' participation in any or all of these programs. 6 (8) Students may receive information about where to obtain contraceptives 7 and abortion referral services only in accordance with a local board's 8 policy regarding parental consent. Any instruction concerning the use 9 of contraceptives or prophylactics shall provide accurate statistical 10 information on their effectiveness and failure rates for preventing pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including Acquired 11 12 Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), HIV/AIDS, in actual use 13 among adolescent populations and shall explain clearly the difference 14 between risk reduction and risk elimination through abstinence. The 15 Department of Health and Human Resources shall provide the most current available information at the beginning of each school year." 16 17

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2006-2007 school year.
