SECTION 1. G.S. 66-58(b)(8) reads as rewritten:

5	<b>SECTION 4.</b> The panel established by Section 2 of this bill shall report to
6	the Joint Legislative Economic Development Oversight Committee as proposed by
7	House Bill 1365 of the 2005 Session of the General Assembly, if that bill is enacted.
8	The panel shall report to the Committee by May 1, of each year on the number and
9	types of determinations made during the preceding year.
10	<b>SECTION 5.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
