	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO LIMIT THE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES IN THE TOWN OF BEACH AND THE CITY OF HENDERSONVILLE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. No building erected within the corporate limits of the TKure Beach may have a height in excess of 35 feet above ground level unbuilding was erected before the effective date of this act. Variances of the limitation shall not be granted. SECTION 2. The height limitation created by Section 1 of this act dapply to spires, belfries, cupolas, antennas, water tanks, ventilators, chimneys, cappurtenances usually required to be placed above the roof level and not intenhuman occupancy. SECTION 3.(a) The maximum building height on any building with corporate limits of the City of Hendersonville shall not exceed 64 feet. For purp this section, building height shall mean the vertical distance measured from the grade to the highest point of the coping of a flat roof, to the deck line of a mansa or to the mean height level between the eaves and ridge of a gable, hip, or gambit The height limitation created by this subsection does not apply to spires, be cupolas, antennas, water tanks, ventilators, chimneys, or other appurtenances required to be placed above the roof level and not intended for human occupar variance to this subsection may be granted.
