6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding the following new
8	subdivision to read:
9	"(45) To Adopt Policies Regarding the Possession and Self-Administration
10	of Asthma or Anaphylaxis Medications by Asthmatic Students. –
11	Local boards of education shall adopt a policy authorizing a student to
12	self-administer asthma medication and to possess at all times an
13	epinephrine auto-injector to treat anaphylaxis. The policy shall
14	include:
15	a. A requirement that the student's parent or guardian provide to
16	the school:
17	1. Written authorization for the student to self-administer
18	asthma medication or epinephrine auto-injector to treat
19	<u>anaphylaxis;</u>
20	2. Written statement and emergency protocol from the
21	student's health care practitioner who prescribed the
22	asthma medication or epinephrine auto-injector verifying
23	that the student has asthma or an allergy that could result
24	in an anaphylactic reaction and has been instructed in
25	self-administration of asthma medications and an
26	epinephrine auto-injector to treat anaphylaxis; and
