2 AN ACT TO ELIMINATE THE PROHIBITION AGAINST CERTAIN SPOUSES OF 3 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF 4 NORTH CAROLINA, MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF A 5 CONSTITUENT INSTITUTION, OR MEMBERS OF THE STATE BOARD OF

COMMUNITY COLLEGES FROM BEING EMPLOYEES OR OFFICERS OF

THE STATE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 116-7(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) From and after July 1, 1973, no No member of the General Assembly or officer or employee of the State or of State, The University of North Carolina, or any constituent institution or spouse of any such member, officer or employee may be a member of the Board of Governors. No spouse of a member of the General Assembly, or of an officer or employee of The University of North Carolina, or any constituent institution may be a member of the Board of Governors. Any member of the Board of Governors who is elected or appointed to the General Assembly or who becomes an officer or employee of the State or of any constituent institution or whose spouse is elected or appointed to the General Assembly or becomes such an officer or employee of The University of North Carolina, or any constituent institution shall be deemed thereupon to resign from his membership on the Board of Governors."

SECTION 2. G.S. 116-31(h) reads as rewritten:

"(h) From and after July 1, 1973, no No member of the General Assembly or officer or employee of the State or of State, The University of North Carolina, or any constituent institution or spouse of any such member, officer or employee shall be eligible for election or appointment as a trustee. No spouse of a member of the General Assembly, or of an officer or employee of a constituent institution may be a trustee of that constituent institution. Any trustee who is elected or appointed to the General Assembly or who becomes an officer or employee of the State or of State, The

<u>University of North Carolina, or</u> any constituent institution or whose spouse is elected or appointed to the General Assembly or becomes <u>such an</u> officer or employee <u>of that constituent institution</u> shall be deemed thereupon to resign from <u>his</u> membership on the board of trustees."

SECTION 3. G.S. 115D-2.1(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) No member of the General Assembly, no officer or employee of the State, and no officer or employee of an institution under the jurisdiction of the State Board and no spouse of any of those persons, shall be eligible to serve on the State Board. No spouse of a member of the General Assembly or of an officer or employee of the Community College System or of an institution under the jurisdiction of the State Board shall be eligible to serve on the State Board. Furthermore, noNo person who within the prior five years has been an employee of the Community Colleges System Office shall be eligible to serve on the State Board."

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
