G.S. 18B-302(i) is repealed. 1 2 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 18B-302 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 3 "(i) A violation of consuming an alcoholic beverage under subsection (b) of this 4 section is a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of two hundred fifty 5 dollars (\$250.00) dollars in addition to the license revocation required under subsection 6 (g) of this section. This penalty is in addition to any other punishment prescribed for a 7 Class 1 misdemeanor by law." 8 **SECTION 5.** G.S. 20-17.3 reads as rewritten: 9 "§ 20-17.3. Revocation for underage purchasers of alcohol. 10 The Division shall revoke for one year the driver's license of any person who has been convicted of violating any of the following: 11 12 (1) G.S. 18B-302(c)(1), (e), or (f); or 13 (2) G.S. 18B-302(b), if the violation occurred while the person was 14 purchasing or attempting to purchase an alcoholic beverage. 15 18B-302(b). If the person's license is currently suspended or revoked, then the revocation under this 16 17 section shall begin at the termination of that revocation." 18 **SECTION 6.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2005, and applies to 19 offenses committed on or after that date.
