3	TO TWO YEARS AND TO CHANGE THE RENEWAL PERIOD FOR DRIVERS
4	LICENSES TO EIGHT YEARS.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-66(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) Annual Renewal. – The registration of a vehicle must be renewed annually.
8	every two years. To renew the registration of a vehicle, the owner of the vehicle must
9	file an application with the Division and pay the required registration fee. The Division
10	may receive and grant an application for renewal of registration at any time before the
11	registration expires."
12	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-87 reads as rewritten:
13	"§ 20-87. Passenger vehicle registration fees.
14	These fees shall be paid to the Division annually per year for the registration and
15	licensing of passenger vehicles, according to the following classifications and
16	schedules:
17	(1) For-Hire Passenger Vehicles. – The fee for a passenger vehicle that is
18	operated for compensation and has a capacity of 15 passengers or less
19	is seventy-eight dollars (\$78.00). The fee for a passenger vehicle that
20	is operated for compensation and has a capacity of more than 15
21	passengers is one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) per hundred pounds of
22	empty weight of the vehicle.
23	(2) U-Drive-It Vehicles. – U-drive-it vehicles shall pay the following tax:
24	Motorcycles: 1-passenger capacity\$18.00
25	2-passenger capacity

15 which do not solicit passengers indiscriminately for hire between
16 points along streets or highways, shall be taxed at the same rate as for him measurement of $C = 20.87(1)$ but whell be issued

20 (5) Private Passenger Vehicles. – There shall be paid to the Division

31 (6) Private Motorcycles. – The base fee on private passenger motorcycles
32 shall be nine dollars (\$9.00); except that when a motorcycle is
33 equipped with an additional form of device designed to transport
34 persons or property, the base fee shall be sixteen dollars (\$16.00). An
35 additional fee of three dollars (\$3.00) is imposed on each private
36 motorcycle registered under this subdivision in addition to the base
37 fee. The revenue from the additional fee, in addition to any other funds
38 appropriated for this purpose, shall be used to fund the Motorcycle
39 Safety Instruction Program created in G.S. 115D-72.
40 (7) Dealer License Plates. – The fee for a dealer license plate is the regular
41 fee for each of the first five plates issued to the same dealer and is
42 one-half the regular fee for each additional dealer license plate issued
43 to the same dealer. The regular fee" is the fee set in subdivision (5) of

12	(10)	Special Mobile Equipment. – The fee for special mobile equipment for			
13		the license year or any part of the license year is two times the fee in			
14		subdivision (5) for a private passenger motor vehicle of not more than			
15		15 passengers.			
16	(11)	Any vehicle fee determined under this section according to the weight			
17		of the vehicle shall be increased by the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) to			
18		arrive at the total fee.			
19	(12)	Low-Speed Vehicles. – The fee for a low-speed vehicle is the same as			
20		the fee for private passengers vehicles of not more than 15
