1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE SUPPLEMENTAL RETIREMENT FUND FOR
3	VOLUNTEER FIREMEN IN THE TOWN OF ELKIN AND TO REPEAL THE
4	PROVISIONS PROVIDING SUPPLEMENTAL RETIREMENT FUNDS FOR
5	FIREMEN IN THE CITY OF BURLINGTON.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of Section 3 of Chapter 391 of the 1971 Session
8	Laws reads as rewritten:
9	"(a) Each active <u>volunteer</u> fireman of the Town who has retired subsequent to
10	January 1, 1969, and who has attained the age of 55 with thirty (30) years' service or
11	more as a town volunteer fireman, shall be entitled to and shall receive in each calendar
12	month following the calendar month in which he or she retires a monthly supplemental
13	retirement benefit equal to one dollar (\$1.00) two dollars (\$2.00) for each full year of
14	service as a volunteer fireman of the Town; provided, in the event, in any calendar
15	month, funds in the Supplemental Retirement Fund are not available to pay a benefit
16	equal to one dollar (\$1.00) two dollars (\$2.00) for each full year of service as a
17	volunteer fireman of the Town, the Board of Trustees shall specify a lesser amount to be
18	paid."
19	SECTION 2. Chapter 321 of the 1969 Session Laws, as amended by
20	Chapter 1144 of the 1979 Session Laws and Chapter 612 of the 1987 Session Laws, is
21	repealed.
22	SECTION 3. All funds remaining in the Burlington Firemen's Supplemental
23	Retirement Fund and the Burlington Volunteer Firemen's Retirement Fund are
24	transferred to the Board of Trustees of the Local Firemen's Relief Fund of the City of
25	Burlington, to be held and administered as provided in Article 84 of Chapter 58 of the
26	General Statutes.
27	SECTION 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2008, and
28	applies to the payment of benefits on or after that date. The remainder of this act is
29	effective when it becomes law.
