AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR AN ADDITIONAL SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE, AND ADDITIONAL DISTRICT COURT JUDGE, FIVE ADDITIONAL ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS, AND OTHER COURT PERSONNEL POSITIONS FOR THE 26TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Superior

SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

22		SECTION 4.	There is appropriated from the Ge	neral Fund to the Judicial

SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of three million three hundred thirty-four thousand seven hundred ten dollars (\$3,334,710) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year and the sum of four million two hundred fifty-one thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars (\$4,251,875) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to provide the additional superior court judge authorized for Superior Court District 26C by this act, the additional district court judge authorized for District Court District 26 by this act, the additional five assistant district attorneys authorized for Prosecutorial District 26 by this act, 52 deputy clerks, 18 victim witness legal assistants, three district court judicial assistants, three assistant clerks, two law clerks, one superior court judicial assistant, one court reporter, and one magistrate.

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective October 1, 2007.
