1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION AND THE FINANCING, WITHOUT APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL FUND, OF CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS OF THE CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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### PART I. SELF-LIQUIDATING PROJECTS

**SECTION 1.** The purpose of this act is: (i) to authorize the construction or acquisition by certain constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina of the capital improvements projects listed in this act for the respective institutions, and (ii) to authorize the financing of these projects with funds available to the institutions from gifts, grants, receipts, self-liquidating indebtedness, Medicare reimbursements for education costs, or other funds, or any combination of these funds, but not including funds received for tuition or appropriated from the General Fund of the State.

**SECTION 2.** The capital improvements projects, and their respective costs, authorized by this act to be constructed or otherwise acquired and financed as provided in Section 1 of this act, are as follows:

**SECTION 3.** At the request of the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina and upon determining that it is in the best interest of the State to do so, the Director of the Budget may authorize an increase or decrease in the cost of, or a change in the method of, funding the projects authorized by this act. In determining whether to authorize a change in cost or funding, the Director of the Budget may consult with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

**SECTION 4.** Pursuant to G.S. 116D-26, the Board of Governors may issue, subject to the approval of the Director of the Budget, at one time or from time to time, special obligation bonds of the Board of Governors for the purpose of paying all or any part of the cost of acquiring, constructing, or providing for the projects authorized by Section 2 and Section 7 of this act. The maximum principal amount of bonds to be issued shall not exceed the specified project costs in Section 2 and Section 7 of this act plus five percent (5%) of such amount to pay issuance expenses, fund reserve funds, pay capitalized interest and pay other related additional costs, plus any increase in the specific project costs authorized by the Director of the Budget pursuant to Section 3 of this act.

SECTION 7. The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill may accomplish the financing of the acquisition and implementation of certain components of its enterprise administrative systems, including, but not limited to, Student, Human Resources, Payroll, and Finance, in an amount not to exceed fifty-nine million dollars (\$59,000,000). Costs related to the project may include, but not be limited to, costs of applicable hardware, software, consulting services, project and support staff, renovation of the Porthole Building on the campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, training services, leases of space for the project, and any technical infrastructure components required to implement the systems for the duration of the project. The project shall be deemed to be a "capital facility" and a "special obligation bond project" for purposes of G.S. 116D-22(5).

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill must report semiannually on its enterprise administrative systems project to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology, the chairs of the Senate and House Finance and Appropriations Committees, and the Fiscal Research Division. The report must be made on January 1 and July 1 of each year until the project is fully funded and operational. The report must include all of the following:

- A summary of project implementation to date and planned (1) implementation activities.
- A summary of expenditures to date by funding source and of planned (2) expenditures by funding source.
- A summary of issued debt and planned issuances. (3)

#### PART II. **REVISE** UNIVERSITY **GENERAL OBLIGATION INDEBTEDNESS**

**SECTION 8.** Pursuant to Section 2(b) of S.L. 2000-3, the General Assembly finds that it is in the best interest of the State to respond to current educational and research program requirements at Elizabeth City State University by (i) changing the scope of "Mitchell-Lewis Residence Hall - Replacement" to a comprehensive renovation project and by (ii) reducing the scope of the "Land Acquisition" project and transferring unused funds to "Lane Hall Classroom Building - Comprehensive Renovation" and "Electrical Distribution System Upgrade" and "Campus Infrastructure Improvements." Section 2(a) of S.L. 2000-3 is therefore amended in the portion under Elizabeth City State University by:

> Renaming "Mitchell-Lewis Residence Hall – Replacement" to read (1) "Mitchell-Lewis Residence Hall – Comprehensive Renovation," and

- Reducing the allocation to "Land Acquisition" by six hundred fifty 1 (2) 2 thousand dollars (\$650,000), and 3 (3) Increasing the allocation to "Lane Hall Classroom Building -4 Comprehensive Renovation" by six hundred thousand dollars 5 (\$600,000), and 6 (4) Increasing the allocation to "Electrical Distribution System Upgrade" 7 by twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), and 8 Increasing the allocation to "Campus Infrastructure Improvements" by (5) 9 twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). 10 **SECTION 9.** Pursuant to Section 2(b) of S.L. 2000-3, the General Assembly 11 finds that it is in the best interest of the State to respond to current educational and 12 research program requirements at North Carolina Central University by reducing the 13 scope of "Hoey Building – Comprehensive Renovation" and transferring unused funds 14 to "Pearson Cafeteria - Expansion" and "Eagleson Residence Hall - Comprehensive 15 Renovation." Section 2(a) of S.L. 2000-3 is therefore amended in the portion under 16 North Carolina Central University by: Reducing the allocation to "Hoey Building - Comprehensive 17 (1) 18 Renovation" by two million three hundred thousand dollars 19 (\$2,300,000),Increasing the allocation to "Pearson Cafeteria - Expansion" by one 20 (2) 21 million dollars (\$1,000,000), and 22 "Eagleson (3) Increasing the allocation to Residence 23 Comprehensive Renovation" by one million three hundred thousand
