	<b>ECTION 1.</b> Article 2 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended
by adding a i	new Part to read: "Part 30. African-American Heritage Commission.
"§143B-135. Commission established.	
(a) Creation; Duties There is created the African-American Heritage	
Commission	in the Department of Cultural Resources to advise and assist the Secretary

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- (b) Membership; Terms. The Commission shall consist of 10 members, each of whom shall serve a three-year term. Three-year terms shall be on a rotating basis, so that no more than four members' terms expire in any given year. Commission members shall be appointed on or before October 31, 2008, as follows:
  - (1) The Governor shall appoint all members, one of whom shall be a member of the North Carolina Historical Commission.
  - (2) The Governor shall designate a member of the African-American Heritage Commission to serve as chairman at his pleasure.
  - (3) Ex officio members shall include the Secretary of Cultural Resources and the Deputy Secretary of the Office of Archives and History, or their designees.
- (c) <u>Vacancies.</u> In the event a vacancy occurs on the Board prior to the expiration of a member's term, the Governor shall appoint a new Board member to serve the unexpired term.
- (d) Removal of Members. The Commission may remove any of its members for neglect of duty, incompetence, or unprofessional conduct. A member subject to disciplinary proceedings shall be disqualified from participating in the official business of the Commission until the charges have been resolved.
- (e) Meetings; Quorum. The Commission shall meet at least semiannually to conduct business. The Commission shall adopt rules governing the calling, holding, and conducting of regular and special meetings. A majority of Commission members shall constitute a quorum."
- **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Cultural Resources the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in recurring funds for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to support the operations of the African-American Heritage Commission, established in Section 1 of this act. The Department of Cultural Resources shall provide necessary clerical and administrative support services to the Commission.
  - **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
