4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	SECTION 1. Article 9 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended		
6	by adding a new section to read:		
7	"§ 143-143.6. Distribution of fuels that are a blend of petroleum and ethanol.		
8	(a) Notwithstanding any other law or rule, E-blend fuel may be dispensed from		
9	equipment that is fully in compliance with all requirements for use in dispensing		
10		<u>r E-10</u>	if all of the following requirements are met by the entity dispensing the
11	<u>fuel:</u>		
12		<u>(1)</u>	The manufacturer of the dispensing equipment has provided a written
13			statement that the dispensing equipment is, in the opinion of the
14			manufacturer, compatible with E-blend and does not present a distinct
15			hazard to the public. The written statement shall reference a particular
16			type and model of equipment and shall be signed by a responsible
17			official on behalf of the manufacturer. The written statement shall be
18 19			retained in the files of the retail outlet or other entity dispensing the
20			fuel and shall be made available to the Office of State Fire Marshal,
21		(2)	<u>upon request.</u> The dispensing equipment fully complies with the requirements
22		<u>(2)</u>	established by State law for dispensing E-10.
23		(3)	The manufacturer has initiated the process of applying to an
24		<u>(5)</u>	independent testing laboratory to have the equipment listed for use in
25			dispensing E-blend fuels.
26	(b)	As use	ed in this section:
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an approved testing laboratory, inspection agency, or other organization concerned with current production evaluation that maintains periodic inspection of production of listed equipment or materials, and whose listing states that equipment or materials comply with approved nationally recognized standards and have been tested or evaluated and found suitable for use in a specified manner."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and expires July 1, 2009.

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
