## SESSION LAW 2010-71 HOUSE BILL 1676

## AN ACT TO RESTORE A BALANCE TO THE LAW ON UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 96-8(10) is amended by adding a new sub-subdivision to read:

"<u>f</u>. No substitute teacher or other substitute school personnel shall be considered unemployed for days or weeks when not called to work unless the individual is or was employed as a full-time substitute during the period of time for which the individual is requesting benefits. For the purposes of this subsection, full-time substitute is defined as a substitute employee who works more than 30 hours a week on a continual basis for a period of six months or more."

SECTION 2. G.S. 96-8(6)k.21. is repealed.

**SECTION 3.** G.S. 96-8(6)k.22. is repealed.

**SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
