Upon 10 notification of expiration of the authorization for any special plate by the Division pursuant to 11 this section, the Revisor of Statutes shall verify that the authorization for each special 12 registration plate listed has expired and shall notate such expiration in the applicable statutes. If 13 an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of 14 Statutes shall revise the subdivision referring to the special registration plate to leave the name 15 of the special plate authorized and the date the special registration plate's authorization expired. If an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of 16 17 Statutes shall also make corresponding changes to reflect the expiration of the special 18 registration plate's authorization, if applicable, in G.S. 20-63(b), 20-79.7, and 20-81.12.

19 **SECTION 10.** The Revisor of Statutes is authorized to alphabetize, number, and 20 renumber the special registration plates listed in G.S. 20-79.4 to ensure that all the special 21 registration plates are listed in alphabetical order and numbered accordingly.

SECTION 11. Section 8 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2011. The remainder
 of this act is effective when it becomes law.
