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"§ 106-168.3. Exemptions.

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Nothing in this Article shall apply to the premises or the rendering operations on the premises of any establishment operating under a numbered permit from the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services as provided by the North Carolina Meat Inspection Act, or under United States government inspection.inspection; provided, however, no person shall be exempt from the requirements of this Article when acting as a collector or when storing or processing waste kitchen grease at a waste kitchen grease operation.

8 "§ 106-168.4. Application for <u>rendering</u> license.

9 Application for license shall be made to the Commissioner of Agriculture, hereinafter called the "Commissioner," on forms provided by him. The application shall set forth the name 10 11 and residence of the applicant, his present or proposed place of business, the particular method which he intends to employ or employs in the processing of raw material, and such other 12 13 information as the Commissioner may require, except that the Commissioner shall not require 14 the submission of blueprints, plans, or specifications of the existing plant or equipment of any person owning and operating a rendering plant in North Carolina on January 1, 1953. require. 15 The applicant shall pay a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) with each 16 17 application, which said fee shall be the only charge made in connection with 18 licensure.application and a renewal fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) annually after meeting 19 the renewal requirements of this Article.

20 "§ 106-168.5. Duties of Commissioner upon receipt of application; the application for a 21 rendering license; inspection committee.

22 Upon receipt of the application, application for a rendering license, the Commissioner shall 23 promptly cause the rendering plant and equipment, or the plans, specifications, and selected 24 site, of the applicant to be inspected by an inspection committee hereinafter called the 25 "committee," which shall be composed of three members: One member who shall be 26 designated by the Commissioner of Agriculture and who shall be an employee of the 27 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, one member who shall be designated by the 28 Secretary of Health and Human Services and who shall be an employee of the Department of 29 Health and Human Services, and one member who shall be designated by the director board of 30 directors of the North Carolina Division of the Southeastern Renderers Association, and who 31 shall be a person having practical knowledge of rendering operations. Each member may be designated and relieved from time to time at the discretion of the designating authority. No 32 33 State employee designated as a member of the committee shall receive any additional 34 compensation therefor and no compensation shall be paid by the State to any other member.

35 "§ 106-168.6. Inspection by committee; certificate of specific findings.

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"§ 106-168.7. Issuance of <u>rendering</u> license.

Upon receipt of the certificate of compliance from the committee, the Commissioner shall issue a <u>rendering</u> license to the applicant to conduct rendering operations as specified in the application. A license shall be valid until revoked for cause as hereinafter provided.<u>for one year</u> and shall be renewed upon submission of a certification under oath of compliance with the requirements under this Article for licensure and payment of the annual renewal fee.

43 "§ 106-168.8. Minimum standards for conducting rendering operations.

The following minimum standards shall be required for all rendering operations subject to the provisions of this Article:

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- (8) <u>Proof of general liability insurance of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) shall</u> be made in a manner satisfactory to the Commissioner.

49 "§ 106-168.9. Transportation by licensee.

50 Any person holding a <u>rendering</u> license under the provisions of this Article, or acting as a 51 collector <u>of raw materials</u> as herein defined, may haul and transport raw material, except such

material as may be specifically prohibited by law or by the rules and regulations promulgated 1

2 by the Commissioner, when such transporting and hauling is done in accordance with the 3 provisions of this Article.

4 "§ 106-168.10. Disposal of diseased animals.

5 Any person holding a rendering license under the provisions of this Article is authorized to kill diseased, sick, old or crippled animals on the premises of the owner upon his request; 6 7 provided that no animal known to have tuberculosis, Bang's disease, anthrax, or any other 8 disease for which quarantine may be imposed, shall be removed from any premises placed 9 under quarantine without permission of the State Veterinarian, or his authorized agent. The 10 licensee shall keep and make available to the Commissioner, upon request, such records as the 11 Commissioner may require with respect to the collection and disposal of dead animals.

"§ 106-168.11. Authority of agents of rendering licensee. 12

13 Authority granted to any person holding a valid rendering license under the provisions of 14 this Article shall extend also to the agents and employees of such person while acting within the scope of their authority. All such agents and employees shall comply with the provisions of 15 this Article and rules and regulations not inconsistent therewith, and shall display evidence of 16 17 such employment or agency upon proper request at any time while so acting.

18 "§ 106-168.12. Commissioner authorized to adopt rules and regulations.

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20 "§ 106-168.13. Effect of failure to comply.

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22 "§ 106-168.14. Collectors of raw material subject to certain provisions.

23 Any collector, collector of raw material, as defined in this Article, G.S. 106-168.1, shall be 24 subject to the provisions of subdivision (5) and subdivision (6) of G.S. 106- 168.8 and the 25 provisions of G.S. 106-168.9, and any rules and regulations adopted by the Commissioner 26 pursuant thereto.

"§ 106-168.14A. Collectors of waste kitchen grease subject to certain provisions. 27

Any collector of waste kitchen grease shall submit an application for licensure to the 28 (a) 29 Commissioner not less than 30 days before conducting any such collection or transportation. 30 Licensure shall be for one year. The application shall be submitted in accordance with a procedure established by the Commissioner for this purpose. The application shall include all 31 32 of the following:

- 33 The applicant's name and address. (1)34
 - (2)A description of the operations to be performed by the applicant.
 - The make, model, license number, and vehicle identification number of any (3)vehicle to be used for the transportation of waste kitchen grease.
 - A nonrefundable application fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). (4)
