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Application for license shall be made to the Commissioner of Agriculture, hereinafter 1 2 called the "Commissioner," on forms provided by him. The application shall set forth the name 3 and residence of the applicant, his present or proposed place of business, the particular method 4 which he intends to employ or employs in the processing of raw material, and such other 5 information as the Commissioner may require, except that the Commissioner shall not require the submission of blueprints, plans, or specifications of the existing plant or equipment of any 6 7 person owning and operating a rendering plant in North Carolina on January 1, 1953. require. 8 The applicant shall pay a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) with each 9 application, which said fee shall be the only charge made in connection with licensure.application and a renewal fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) annually after meeting 10 the renewal requirements of this Article. 11

12 "§ 106-168.5. Duties of Commissioner upon receipt of application; the application for a 13 rendering license; inspection committee.

14 Upon receipt of the application, application for a rendering license, the Commissioner shall promptly cause the rendering plant and equipment, or the plans, specifications, and selected 15 site, of the applicant to be inspected by an inspection committee hereinafter called the 16 17 "committee," which shall be composed of three members: One member who shall be designated by the Commissioner of Agriculture and who shall be an employee of the 18 19 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, one member who shall be designated by the 20 Secretary of Health and Human Services and who shall be an employee of the Department of 21 Health and Human Services, and one member who shall be designated by the director-board of directors of the North Carolina Division of the Southeastern-Renderers Association, and who 22 23 shall be a person having practical knowledge of rendering operations. Each member may be 24 designated and relieved from time to time at the discretion of the designating authority. No 25 State employee designated as a member of the committee shall receive any additional 26 compensation therefor and no compensation shall be paid by the State to any other member.

"§ 106-168.7. Issuance of <u>rendering</u> license.

Upon receipt of the certificate of compliance from the committee, the Commissioner shall issue a <u>rendering</u> license to the applicant to conduct rendering operations as specified in the application. A license shall be valid until revoked for cause as hereinafter provided.for one year and shall be renewed upon submission of a certification under oath of compliance with the requirements under this Article for licensure and payment of the annual renewal fee.

Any person holding a <u>rendering</u> license under the provisions of this Article, or acting as a collector as herein defined, may haul and transport raw <u>material</u>, <u>material</u> or <u>waste kitchen</u> <u>grease</u>, except such material <u>or waste kitchen grease</u> as may be specifically prohibited by law or by the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commissioner, when such transporting and hauling is done in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

	notice that unauthorized removal is prohibited without written consent of the owner of the container, that person shall be guilty of:		
	(1)	A Class 1 misdemeanor if the value of the waste kitchen grease container, or

		dollars (\$1,000) or less.
