Short Title: Accountability for Publicly Funded Nonprofits. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: March 31, 2011 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE GREATER ACCOUNTABILITY FOR NONPROFIT ENTITIES 3 THAT RECEIVE PUBLIC FUNDING. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 SECTION 1. Part 2 of Article 16 of Chapter 55A of the General Statutes is 6 amended by adding a new section to read: 7 "§ 55A-16-24. Financial statements for the public. 8 Notwithstanding any provisions in the articles of incorporation or bylaws, a (a) 9 corporation that receives any public funding in the form of grants or loans, or receives any 10 in-kind donation, from a local government, the State, or the federal government shall provide 11 its latest annual financial statements upon written demand from any member of the public. The statements shall be substantively similar to those required under G.S. 55A-16-20 but shall 12 contain additional details about the amount of public funds received and how those funds were 13 14 used. Additionally, a corporation that receives public funding shall provide, upon written demand from any member of the public, a copy of its most recently completed and filed 15 16 Internal Revenue Service Form 990, except of any information not required for public disclosure pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 6104(d)(3). A corporation may comply with the provisions 17 18 of this section by maintaining on its public Web site a financial report as described in this section and a copy of its most recent Internal Revenue Service Form 990 or by having such 19 20 materials posted, as part of a database of similar documents of other tax-exempt organization, 21 on a Web site established and maintained by another entity, provided that the entity does not 22 charge a fee to access the information and provided that the corporation provides a link on its public Web site to the Web site maintained by the other entity. 23 24 (b) Exceptions. - The following corporations already required to report information 25 shall not be subject to subsection (a) of this section, but shall provide information on their public Web site to whom the corporation reports its information and how to access that 26 27 information: 28 A corporation required to report to the North Carolina Medical Care (1)29 Commission of the Department of Health and Human Services. 30 A corporation required to report to the Local Government Commission of (2)31 the Department of State Treasurer. 32 A private college that meets the definition of "institution" under G.S. 116-22 (3) 33 and is required to report to the State under G.S. 143C-6-23." 34 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2011, and applies to nonprofit corporations receiving public funding in the form of grants or loans on or after that date. 35
