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1 (a6) The members of the authority shall be appointed within 30 days after this section 2 becomes law. One member appointed by the Town of Butner, one member appointed by the 3 Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety, and the member appointed by the Secretary shall 4 serve an initial term of two years. The remaining members shall serve an initial term of four 5 years. The beginning date of each initial term for purposes of reappointment shall be September 6 1, 2011. Thereafter, each member shall serve a term of four years.

- 7 The Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety may employauthority shall (a7) 8 employ or contract with a State agency or unit of local government for the provision of special 9 police officers for the territory of the Butner Reservation. The Secretary of Crime Control and 10 Public Safety shall contract with the Town of Butner Reservation and for personnel to provide fire and police protection to those areas within the incorporated limits of the Town of Butner. 11 The territorial jurisdiction of these officers shall consist of the property shown on a map 12 13 produced May 20, 2003, by the Information Systems Division of the North Carolina General 14 Assembly and kept on file in the office of the Butner Town Manager and in the office of the Director of the Butner Public Safety Division of the Department of Crime Control and Public 15 Safety authority and such additional areas which are within the incorporated limits of the Town 16 17 of Butner as shown on a map to be kept in the office of the Butner Town Manager and in the 18 office of the Director of the Butner Public Safety Division of the Department of Crime Control 19 and Public Safety. authority. The Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety may organize 20 these special police officers assigned to the authority shall be organized into a public safety 21 department for that territory and may establish it as a division within that principal department 22 as permitted by Chapter 143B of the General Statutes.territory.
- 23 After taking the oath of office required for law-enforcement officers, the special (b)24 police officers authorized by this section shall have the authority of deputy sheriffs of Durham 25 and Granville Counties in those counties respectively. Within the territorial jurisdiction stated 26 in subsection (a)(a7) of this section, the special police officers have the primary responsibility 27 to enforce the laws of North Carolina, the ordinances of the Town of Butner, and any rule 28 applicable to the Butner Reservation adopted under authority of this Part or under 29 G.S. 143-116.6 or G.S. 143-116.7 or under the authority granted any other agency of the State 30 and also have the powers set forth for firemen in Articles 80, 82, and 83 of Chapter 58 of the 31 General Statutes. Any civil or criminal process to be served on any individual confined at any 32 State facility within the territorial jurisdiction described in subsection (a) of this section 33 shall be forwarded by the sheriff of the county in which the process originated to the Director 34 of the Butner Public Safety Division.authority. Special police officers authorized by this section 35 shall be assigned to transport any individual transferred to or from any State facility within the 36 territorial jurisdiction described in subsection (a)(a7) of this section to or from the psychiatric 37 service of the University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill.
- (c) The <u>authority shall contract with the State to provide fire and police protection to</u>
 those portions of the Butner Reservation outside of the corporate limits of the Town of Butner.
 The authority shall also contract with the Town of Butner to provide fire and police protection
 within the corporate limits of the Town of Butner. The contract between the Town of Butner
 and the Department of Crime Control and Public Safetycontracts shall provide that: for the
 following:

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1	(e) In the event that either the Town of Butner or the State shall fail to pay the authority
2	its percentage share of the authority's budget as described in this section, the nonpaying party
3	shall cease to be a participant in the authority at the expiration of the fiscal year for which it has
4	last paid its percentage share of the budget for the authority. The remaining participant may file
5	a resolution with the Secretary of State indicating that it is the sole remaining participant in the
6	authority. All of the property of the authority shall remain with the authority. At the expiration
7	of the fiscal year for which the nonpaying party last paid its percentage share of the budget for
8	the authority, the remaining participant in the authority also may file articles of dissolution
9	dissolving the authority with the Secretary of State. In the case of such dissolution, the property
10	of the authority shall be distributed to the remaining party filing the articles of dissolution."
11	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
