5	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-288(g) reads as rewritten:		
6	"(g) To Report Certain Acts to Law Enforcement and the Superintendent WI	nen the	
7	principal has personal knowledge knowledge, a reasonable belief, or actual notice from		
8	personnel that an act has occurred on school property involving assault resulting in	serious	
9	personal injury, sexual assault, sexual offense, rape, kidnapping, indecent liberties	with a	
10	minor, assault involving the use of a weapon, possession of a firearm in violation of the	he law,	
11	possession of a weapon in violation of the law, or possession of a controlled substa	ance in	
12	violation of the law, the principal shall immediately report the act to the appropriate low	cal law	
13	enforcement agency. Failure to report to law enforcement under this subsection is a (Class 3	
14	misdemeanor.		
15	A principal who willfully fails to make a report to law enforcement required	<u>by this</u>	
16	subsection may be subject to demotion or dismissal pursuant to G.S. 115C-325.		
17	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board of Education shall not		
18	the principal to report to law enforcement acts in addition to those required to be repo	<u>rted by</u>	
19	this subsection.		
20	For purposes of this subsection, "school property" shall include any public school bu	0	
21	bus, public school campus, grounds, recreational area, or athletic field, in the charge	of the	
22	principal.		
23	The principal or the principal's designee shall notify the superintendent		
24	superintendent's designee in writing or by electronic mail regarding any report made		
25	enforcement under this subsection. This notification shall occur by the end of the work	-	
26	which the incident occurred when reasonably possible but not later than the end		
27	following workday. The superintendent shall provide the information to the local be	oard of	
28	education.		
29	Nothing in this subsection shall be interpreted to interfere with the due process ri	<u>ghts of</u>	
30	school employees or the privacy rights of students."	•.•	
31	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning	ng with	
32	the 2011-2012 school year.
