"(2) Every State agency shall include in every recommendation or report on any action involving expenditure of public moneys or use of public land for projects and programs significantly affecting the quality of the environment of this State, a detailed statement by the responsible official setting forth all of the following:			
a. The environmental impact of the proposed action; action.			
b.	Any significant adverse environmental effects which cannot be		
.	avoided should the proposal be implemented; implemented.		
c.	Mitigation measures proposed to minimize the impact; impact.		
d.	Alternatives to the proposed action; action.		
e.	The relationship between the short-term uses of the environment		
-	involved in the proposed action and the maintenance and enhancement of long-term productivity; and productivity.		
f.	Any irreversible and irretrievable environmental changes which		
	would be involved in the proposed action should it be implemented.		
<u>g.</u>	Any significant adverse impacts affecting farms, including impacts		
_	that could result in the loss of farmland acreage or the loss of the use		
	of the farmland acreage, impacts that could interfere with the		
	landowner or farmer using the property for any bona fide farm		
	purpose, and impacts that obstruct ingress and egress to farm		
	equipment in the long term. As used in this sub-subdivision, 'bona		
	fide farm purpose' has the same meaning as in G.S. 153A-340.		
<u>h.</u>	Measures proposed to avoid, minimize, and mitigate the adverse		
	impacts to farms under sub-subdivision g. of this subdivision and		

alternatives to the proposed action." **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to any environmental impact statements subject to Article 1 of Chapter 113A of the General Statutes that are prepared on or after that date.
