2	greater punishment, a person is guilty of a Class I felony Class H felony if the person violates	
3	subsection (a) of this section and (i) inflicts serious bodily injury or (ii) uses a deadly weapon	
4	other than a firearm.	
5	(c) Unless a person's conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing	
6	greater punishment, a person is guilty of a Class F felony if the person violates subsection (a) of	
7	this section and uses a firearm."	
8	SECTION 3. G.S. 14-288.9(c) reads as rewritten:	
9	"(c) Any person who commits an assault <u>causing physical injury</u> upon emergency	
10	personnel is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Class I felony. Any person who commits an	
11	assault upon emergency personnel with or through the use of any dangerous weapon or	
12	substance shall be punished as a Class F felon."	
13	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective December 1, 2011, and applies to	
14	offenses committed on or after that date. Prosecutions for offenses committed before the	
15	effective date of this act are not abated or affected by this act, and the statutes that would be	
16	applicable but for this act remain applicable to those prosecutions.
