1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT ANY JUSTICE OR JUDGE OF THE GENERAL COURT OF
3	JUSTICE OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA WHO HAS A CONCEALED
4	HANDGUN PERMIT THAT IS VALID IN NORTH CAROLINA IS EXEMPT FROM
5	THE GENERAL PROHIBITION AGAINST CARRYING A CONCEALED WEAPON
6	AND FROM THE PROHIBITIONS AGAINST CARRYING A WEAPON ON CERTAIN
7	PREMISES OR IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-269(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
10	"(4d) Any person who is a justice or judge of the General Court of Justice in North
11	Carolina and who has a concealed handgun permit issued in accordance with
12	Article 54B of this Chapter or considered valid under G.S. 14-415.24;
13	provided that the person shall not carry a concealed weapon at any time
14	while consuming alcohol or an unlawful controlled substance or while
15	alcohol or an unlawful controlled substance remains in the person's body."
16	SECTION 2. G.S. 14-415.27 reads as rewritten:
17	"§ 14-415.27. Expanded permit scope for district attorneys, assistant district attorneys,
18	and investigators employed by office of the district attorney. attorney, justices,
19	and judges.
20	Notwithstanding G.S. 14-415.11(c), any person who is a district attorney, an assistant
21	district attorney, or an investigator employed by the office of a district attorney and of the
22	following persons who has a concealed handgun permit issued pursuant to this Article or that is
23	considered valid under G.S. 14-415.24 is not subject to the area prohibitions set out in
24	G.S. 14-415.11(c) and may carry a concealed handgun in the areas listed in G.S. 14-415.11(c)
25	unless otherwise prohibited by federal law.law:
26	(1) <u>A district attorney.</u>
27	(2) <u>An assistant district attorney.</u>
28	(3) An investigator employed by the office of a district attorney.
29	(4) <u>A justice or judge of the General Court of Justice in North Carolina.</u> "
30	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2013.
