7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 153A-221(d) reads as rewritten:			
8	"(d) Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, each dormitory in a county			
9	detention faci	ility may house up to 64 inmates as long as the dormitory provides al	l of the	
10	following:			
11	(1)	) A minimum floor space of 70 square feet per inmate, including b	ooth the	
12		sleeping and dayroom areas.		
13	(2)	) One shower per eight inmates, one toilet per eight inmates, one sinl	c with a	
14		security mirror per eight inmates, and one water fountain.		
15	(3)	) A telephone jack or other telephone arrangement provided wit	hin the	
16		dormitory.		
17	(4)	) Space designed to allow a variety of activities.		
18	(5)	) Sufficient seating and tables for all inmates.		
19	(6)	) A way for officers to observe the entire area from the entrance.		
20	This subsection applies only to those counties that have a population in excess of			
21	300,000,250,000, according to the most recent decennial federal census."			
22	SE	ECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
