- AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OR CONSTRUCTION AND THE
 FINANCING, WITHOUT APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL FUND, OF
 CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS OF THE CONSTITUENT
 INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.
- 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

9 **SECTION 1.** The purpose of this act is to authorize (i) the acquisition or 10 construction of the capital improvements projects listed in this act for the respective institutions 11 of The University of North Carolina and (ii) the financing of these projects with funds available 12 to the institutions from gifts, grants, receipts, self-liquidating indebtedness, Medicare 13 reimbursements for education costs, hospital receipts from patient care, or other funds, or any 14 combination of these funds, but not including funds received for tuition or appropriated from 15 the General Fund of the State unless previously authorized by General Statute.

16 SECTION 2.(a) The capital improvements projects and their respective costs 17 authorized by this act to be constructed and financed as provided in Section 1 of this act, 18 including by revenue bonds, by special obligation bonds as authorized in Section 4 of this act, 19 or by both, are as follows:

36	SECTION 3. At the request of the Board of Governors of		
37	Carolina and upon determining that it is in the best interest of the Sta	-	
38	the Budget may authorize an increase or decrease in the cost of, or a change in the method of,		
39	funding the projects authorized by this act. In determining whether to authorize a change in cost		
40	or funding, the Director of the Budget may consult with the Joint Legislative Commission on		
41	Governmental Operations.		
42	SECTION 4. Pursuant to G.S. 116D-26, the Board of Go	overnors may issue, subject	
43	to the approval of the Director of the Budget, at one time or from time to time, special		
44	obligation bonds of the Board of Governors for the purpose of paying all or any part of the cost		
45	of acquiring, constructing, or providing for the projects authorized by Section 2 of this act. The		
46	maximum principal amount of bonds to be issued shall not exceed the specified project costs in		
47	Section 2 of this act plus five percent (5%) of such amount to pay issuance expenses, fund		
48	reserve funds, pay capitalized interest, and pay other related additional costs, plus any increase		
49	in the specific project costs authorized by the Director of the Budge	et pursuant to Section 3 of

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General Assembly Of North Carolina Session 2013 1 **SECTION 5.** With respect to Winston-Salem State University's Bowman Gray & 2 Civitan Park Acquisition project, the institution may accomplish construction, acquisition, and 3 financing notwithstanding the requirement in G.S. 116D-22(5) as to location at the institution 4 and either through (i) direct ownership of the project or (ii) by participation in a long-term 5 agreement with the City of Winston-Salem if all of the following requirements are met: 6 Where the property that is the subject of the project is a stadium that (1)7 supports a NASCAR-sanctioned one-fourth mile asphalt flat oval short track, 8 the stadium is not renamed. 9 (2)Where the property that is the subject of the project is a stadium that 10 supports a NASCAR-sanctioned one-fourth mile asphalt flat oval short track, 11 no parking fees are charged for racing events at the stadium. 12 (3) Where the property that is the subject of the project is a stadium that 13 supports a NASCAR-sanctioned one-fourth mile asphalt flat oval short track, 14 no prohibitions are placed on spectators of racing events at the stadium that 15 would prohibit the spectators from entering with food, nonalcoholic 16 beverages, or both. Nothing in this subdivision shall prohibit regulations 17 imposed on containers deemed necessary for public safety. 18 (4) Where the property that is the subject of the project is a stadium that 19 supports a NASCAR-sanctioned one-fourth mile asphalt flat oval short track, 20 the institution continues to make the property available for racing and 21 racing-related events in a manner consistent with and under terms similar to 22 those agreed upon for the use of the property immediately prior to the 23 acquisition. 24 SECTION 6. In support of Section 5 of this act and "NASCAR's longest-running 25 weekly race track" located within Bowman Gray Stadium, G.S. 18B-1006(a) reads as rewritten: School and College Campuses. - No permit for the sale of malt beverages, 26 "(a) 27 unfortified wine, or fortified wine shall be issued to a business on the campus or property of a 28 public school or college, other than at a regional facility as defined by G.S. 160A-480.2 29 operated by a facility authority under Part 4 of Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the General 30 Statutes except for a public school or college function, unless that business is a hotel or a 31 nonprofit alumni organization with a mixed beverages permit or a special occasion permit. This 32 subsection shall not apply on property owned by a local board of education which was leased 33 for 99 years or more to a nonprofit auditorium authority created prior to 1991 whose governing 34 board is appointed by a city board of aldermen, a county board of commissioners, or a local 35 school board. This subsection shall also not apply to the constituent institutions of The 36 University of North Carolina with respect to the sale of beer and wine at (i) performing arts 37 centers located on property owned or leased by the institutions if the seating capacity does not 38 exceed 2,000 seats, or toseats; (ii) any golf courses owned or leased by the institutions and open 39 to the public for use use; or (iii) any stadiums that support a NASCAR-sanctioned one-fourth mile asphalt flat oval short track, that are owned or leased by the institutions, and that only sell 40 41 malt beverages, unfortified wine, or fortified wine at events that are not sponsored or funded by 42 the institutions." 43 **SECTION 7.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
