1A BILL TO BE ENTITLED2AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO3CREATE AN INTERAGENCY TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE EXPANSION OF4TELEMEDICINE IN THIS STATE AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A HEALTH5HOME INITIATIVE FOR PATIENTS WITH CHRONIC CONDITIONS.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 SECTION 1.(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly to improve access and 8 quality of care for underserved patients by enabling health care professionals to provide these 9 patients with consultations and specialty care through telemedicine, which is defined as the use 10 of synchronous video conferencing, remote patient monitoring, and asynchronous health 11 images or other health transmissions supported by mobile devices or other telecommunications 12 technology by a health care provider to deliver health care services relating to the health care 13 diagnosis or treatment of a patient at a site other than the site where the provider is located.

14 **SECTION 1.(b)** The Department of Health and Human Services, in consultation 15 with the Department of Insurance, the Division in the Department of State Treasurer responsible for the State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees, and other agencies as 16 17 applicable, shall create an interagency task force responsible for studying the feasibility and 18 desirability of (i) advancing the use of telemedicine in this State by requiring health insurers, as defined in G.S. 108A-55.4, health maintenance organizations, the State's Medicaid Plan, and 19 20 the State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees to provide the same coverage and 21 reimbursement for health care services delivered through telemedicine as that provided for 22 health care services delivered through in-person consultation and (ii) implementing a health 23 home initiative for Medicaid enrollees and other patients with multiple chronic conditions to 24 enable health care providers to communicate with one another utilizing health information 25 technology, whenever possible, to address all of the patients' health care needs in a collective, 26 comprehensive, and cost-effective manner.

SECTION 1.(c) By no later than December 1, 2014, the Task Force shall report the
results of its study and any recommendations to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on
Health and Human Services.

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SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
