## **BILL SUMMARY**:

H379 Amends GS 90-186 (Special powers of the Board), providing that the North Carolina Veterinary Medical Board (Board) may increase fees as long as no fee is increased more than 15 percent within a calendar year and the cumulative total increases of any fee does not exceed 100 percent of the fee amounts set in this subdivision.

It provides for set fees on all the different certifications, licenses, and examinations; fees are set at the highest rate previously allowed (previously, there was a sliding scale with only a ceiling price set), with the inspection of a veterinary practice facility being raised to \$125 (\$75 was the highest that could be charged before). The bill deletes the provision for charging for copies of Board materials.

H379 amends GS 90-187.9 (Reinstatement), deleting language of old section and creating a new GS 90-187.9(a-d), that sets forth provisions to renew one's license.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:**

H379 changes the language regarding the fees collected by the North Carolina Veterinary Medical Board. The language changes the current fees from their "up to" amount to a set amount. The table below (Table 1) lists those fees that would be changed, comparing current fees to the proposed fees.

The only fee changed to exceed the current maximum increases the inspection of a veterinary practice facility fee from \$75.00 to \$125.00. The Board estimates approximately 584 inspections take place yearly, yielding an increase of \$29,200.

Also, the bill allows the Board to increase all set fees, provided that no fee shall be increased more than 15% within a calendar year and that the cumulative total increases of any fee shall not exceed 100% of the listed fee amounts. Table 2 shows the impact of the maximum 15% yearly fee increase on the fee amount. Also, the potential minimum (Table 3) and maximum (Table 4) revenue impacts are shown below. Table 3 assumes that the Board keeps the current rate stable, while Table 4 assumes the Board adopts the possible 15% maximum yearly fee increase capped at 100% of the listed fee amount.
