2	to the dogs.		
3	(b) Any person who owns, has custody of, or maintains 10 or more female dogs over		
4	the age of six months that are capable of reproduction and kept primarily for the purpose of		
5	breeding and selling the offspring as pets shall keep the facility and primary enclosures clean		
5	and free from debris and odor and shall remove feces and dispose of them as frequently as		
7	necessary so as not to pose a threat to the health of the dogs.		
8	(c) Failure to comply with the standards established under subsections (a) and (b) of		
)	this section constitutes a Class 3 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than twenty-five		
)	dollars (\$25.00) per animal nor more than a total of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), unless the		
	person has previously pled guilty or nolo contendere to, or been found guilty of, a violation of		
2	this section, in which case each such violation is a Class 1 misdemeanor. Each violation shall		
;	constitute a separate offense.		
Ļ	(d) The provisions of this section are in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other State or		
í	federal laws protecting animal welfare. This section shall not be construed to limit any State		
)	law or regulation protecting the welfare of animals, nor shall anything in this section prevent a		
	local governing body from adopting and enforcing its own animal welfare laws and regulations		
	in addition to this section. This section shall not be construed to place any numerical limits on		
	the number of dogs a person may own or control or to regulate persons' ownership of dogs		
	when those dogs are not used for breeding and selling any offspring for use as a pet. Nothing in		
	this section shall be construed to limit hunting or the ability to breed, raise, sell, control, train,		
	or possess dogs with the intention to use those dogs for hunting or other sporting purposes.		
	(e) This section does not apply to kennels or boarding facilities in which the majority of		
	the dogs are:		
	(1) Being bred or trained primarily for hunting, sporting, field trials, or show;		
	(2) Being maintained primarily for hunting, sporting, field trials, or show; or		
	(3) Kept primarily for purposes other than the sale of offspring as pets."		
	SECTION 2. If any provision of this act, or the application of this act to any		
	person or circumstances, is held invalid or unconstitutional, that invalidity or		
)	unconstitutionality shall not affect other provisions or applications of this act that can be given		
L	effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application, and to this end, the		
2	provisions of this act are severable.
