6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. Article 35 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
8	adding a new section to read:
9	" <u>§ 14-277.6. Threats against law enforcement officers or correctional officers.</u>
10	(a) <u>Any person who knowingly and willfully makes any threat to inflict serious bodily</u>
11	injury upon or to kill any law enforcement officer or correctional officer or who knowingly and
12	willfully makes any threat to inflict serious bodily injury upon or kill any other person as
13	retaliation against any law enforcement officer or correctional officer because of the exercise of
14	that officer's duties is guilty of a Class I felony.
15	(b) Any person who knowingly and willfully deposits for conveyance in the mail any
16	letter, writing, or other document containing a threat to commit an offense described in
17	subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a Class I felony.
18	(c) In prosecutions under this section, it is not necessary to prove that any law
19	enforcement officer or correctional officer actually received the threatening communication or
20	actually believed the threat."
21	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2015, and applies to
22	offenses committed on or after that date.
