1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT EXEMPTING ISOLATION FLOAT TANKS FROM PUBLIC SWIMMING POOL
3	LAWS AND CLARIFYING THAT LICENSED PHYSICAL THERAPISTS ARE
4	AUTHORIZED TO PRESCRIBE THE USE OF ISOLATION FLOAT TANKS IN THE
5	COURSE OF PHYSICAL THERAPY.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 130A-280 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 130A-280. Scope.
9	This Article provides for the regulation of public swimming pools in the State as they may
10	affect the public health and safety. As used in this Article, the term "public swimming pool"
11	means any structure, chamber, or tank containing an artificial body of water used by the public
12	for swimming, diving, wading, recreation, or therapy, together with buildings, appurtenances,
13	and equipment used in connection with the body of water, regardless of whether a fee is
14	charged for its use. The term includes municipal, school, hotel, motel, apartment, boarding
15	house, athletic club, or other membership facility pools and spas. This Article does not apply to
16	a private pool serving a single family dwelling and used only by the residents of the dwelling
17	and their guests. This Article also does not apply to therapeutic pools, including isolation
18	float tanks, used in physical therapy programs operated by medical facilities licensed by the
19	Department or operated <u>or owned</u> by a licensed physical therapist, nor to therapeutic chambers
20	drained, cleaned, and refilled after each individual use."
21	SECTION 2. G.S. 90-270.24(4) reads as rewritten:
22	"(4) "Physical therapy" means the evaluation or treatment of any person by the
23	use of physical, chemical, or other properties of heat, light, water, electricity,
24	sound, massage, or therapeutic exercise, or other rehabilitative procedures,
25	with or without assistive devices, for the purposes of preventing, correcting,
26 27	or alleviating a physical or mental disability. Physical therapy includes the performance of specialized tests of neuromuscular function, administration
27	of specialized therapeutic procedures, interpretation and implementation of
28 29	referrals from licensed medical doctors or dentists, and establishment and
29 30	modification of physical therapy programs for patients.patients, including
31	programs prescribed solely at the discretion of the physical therapist that
32	involve the use of isolation float tanks. Evaluation and treatment of patients
33	may involve physical measures, methods, or procedures as are found
34	commensurate with physical therapy education and training and generally or
35	specifically authorized by regulations of the Board. Physical therapy
36	education and training shall include study of the skeletal manifestations of
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1	systemic disease. Physical therapy does not include the application of
2	roentgen rays or radioactive materials, surgery, manipulation of the spine
3	unless prescribed by a physician licensed to practice medicine in North
4	Carolina, or medical diagnosis of disease."
5	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
