2	IMPERIAL FOOD PRODUCTS FIRE.
3	Whereas, on September 3, 1991, a grease fire swept quickly through the
4	Imperial Food Products plant, a chicken processing plant in Hamlet, North Carolina;
5	and
6	Whereas, blocked and unmarked exits and locked doors and the absence of
7	fire alarms and a sprinkler system resulted in the deaths of 26 people and injuries to 56
8	others; and

17	in the closing of the Imperial Food Products plant and the loss of 200 jobs; and
18	Whereas, the fire is the worst industrial disaster in North Carolina history;

20	Whereas, stricter workplace safety laws were enacted after the fire to help
21	prevent this type of tragedy from happening again; Now, therefore,
22	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:
23	<b>SECTION 1.</b> The General Assembly extends its deepest sympathy to the
24	families and friends of the victims of the Imperial Food Products plant fire in Hamlet,
25	North Carolina.
26	<b>SECTION 2.</b> The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this
27	resolution to each of the survivors and the families of the victims of the fire, and the
28	Mayor of the City of Hamlet.
29	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This resolution is effective upon ratification.
