A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND CERTAIN PROVISIONS UNDER THE DIETETICS/NUTRITION PRACTICE ACT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF DIETETICS/NUTRITION TO INCREASE FEES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 90-354(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Of the members initially appointed, the professional member appointed by the Governor, one of the professional members appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one of the professional members appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President of the Senate shall be appointed for three year terms; one of the public members appointed by the Governor, one of the professional members appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one of the professional members appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President of the Senate shall be appointed for two year terms; and one of the public members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for a one year term. After the initial terms specified in this subsection, members Members of the Board shall take office on the first day of July immediately following the expired term of that office and shall serve for a term of three years and until their successors are appointed and qualified."

SECTION 2. G.S. 90-355 reads as rewritten:

"§ 90-355. Election of officers; meetings of Board.

- (a) Within 30 days after making appointments to the Board, the Governor shall call the first meeting of the Board. The Board shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman who shall hold office according to rules adopted by the Board.
- (b) The Board shall hold at least two regular meetings each year as provided by rules adopted by the Board. The Board may hold additional meetings upon the call of the chairman or any two Board members. A majority of the Board membership shall constitute a quorum."
