A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AT GREENSBORO TO REGULATE PARKING ON CERTAIN STREETS.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 116-44.5 reads as rewritten:		
"§ 116-44.5. Special provisions applicable to identified constituent institutions of the University of North Carolina.		
In addition to the powers granted by G.S. 116-42.1, the board of trustees of each of		

(1) The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of motor vehicles on those portions of the following public streets in the Town of Chapel Hill where parking is not prohibited by an ordinance

the constituent institutions enumerated hereinafter shall have the additional powers

of the Town of Chapel Hill:

a. Battle Lane;

- b. Country Club Road, between Raleigh Street and South Road;
- c. Manning Drive;
- d. McCauley Street, between Columbia Street and Pittsboro Street;
- e. Pittsboro Street, between South Columbia Street and Cameron Avenue;
- f. Boundary Street, between Country Club Road and East Franklin Street:
- g. Park Place, between Boundary Street and East Franklin Street;
- h. South Columbia Street, between Franklin Street and Manning Drive;

1 i. Cameron Avenue, between South Columbia Street and Raleigh 2 Street: 3 Raleigh Street; į. Ridge Road; 4 k. 5 South Road, between Columbia Street and Country Club Road. 6 In addition, the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina 7 at Chapel Hill may regulate traffic on Cameron Avenue, between 8 Raleigh Street and South Columbia Street, and on Raleigh Street, in 9 any manner not inconsistent with ordinances of the Town of Chapel Hill. 10 11 (2) The Board of Trustees of Appalachian State University may by 12 ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of motor vehicles on 13 those portions of the following public streets in the Town of Boone where parking is not prohibited by an ordinance of the Town of 14 15 Boone: Faculty Street, between U.S. 221-U.S. 321 (Hardin Street) and 16 a. Water Street: 17 Stadium Drive, between Faculty Street and Fernclift Drive; 18 b. College Street, between U.S. 421-U.S. 321 (King Street) and 19 c. 20 Locust Street: 21 Appalachian Street, between Locust Street and Howard Street; d. 22 Brown Street, between Locust Street and Howard Street. 23 The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte (3) may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of motor 24 25 vehicles on those portions of the following public roads in the County of Mecklenburg where parking is not prohibited by ordinance or other 26 source of legal regulation of the County of Mecklenburg or other 27 governmental entity with jurisdiction to regulate parking on such 28 29 public road: 30 Mary Alexander Boulevard (State Road No. 2834), between its a. intersection with N.C. Highway 49 and its intersection with 31 32 Mallard Creek Church Road. 33 In addition, the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina 34 at Charlotte may regulate traffic on Mary Alexander Boulevard (State 35 Road No. 2834), between its intersection with N.C. Highway 49 and its intersection with Mallard Creek Church Road, in any manner not 36 inconsistent with any ordinances or other sources of legal regulation of 37 the County of Mecklenburg or other governmental entity with 38 jurisdiction to regulate traffic on such public road. 39 The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at 40 (3a) Wilmington may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking 41 of motor vehicles on those portions of the following public streets in 42 the City of Wilmington where parking is not prohibited by an 43

ordinance of the City of Wilmington:

2	(3b)	The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at

7		a. Forest Street between Oakland Avenue and Spring Garden
8		Street.
9		b. Highland Avenue between Oakland Avenue and Spring Garden
10		Street.
11		c. Jefferson Street between Spring Garden Street and the
12		Walker/Aycock parking lot.
13		d. Kenilworth Street between Oakland Avenue and Walker
14		Avenue.
15		e. McIver Street between Walker Avenue and West Market Street.
16		<ul> <li><u>McIver Street between Walker Avenue and West Market Street.</u></li> <li><u>Stirling Street between Oakland Avenue and Walker Avenue.</u></li> </ul>
17		g. Theta Street between Kenilworth Street and Stirling Street.
18		h. Walker Avenue between Aycock Street and Jackson Library
19		and between Tate Street and McIver Street.
20	(4)	This section does not diminish the authority of any affected
21		municipality, county or other governmental entity to prohibit parking
22		on any public street or road listed herein. It is intended only to
23		authorize the respective boards of trustees of the constituent
24		institutions identified hereinabove to further prohibit, regulate, and
25		limit parking on certain public streets and roads running through or
26		adjacent to the campuses of the constituent institutions where parking
27		is not prohibited by ordinance or other law of any affected
28		municipality, county or other governmental entity. When an ordinance
29		or other law of an affected municipality, county or other governmental
30		entity is adopted to prohibit parking on any portion of any public street
31		or road then regulated by an ordinance of a board of trustees, the
32		ordinance of the board of trustees is superseded and the University
33		upon request of the municipality, county or other governmental entity
34		shall immediately remove any signs, devices, or markings erected or
35		placed by the University on that portion of the street or road pursuant
36		to the superseded ordinance."
37	SEC'	<b>FION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
