AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO IDENTIFY PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO LOW-PERFORMING AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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SECTION 1. Part 3 of Article 8B of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:

"§ 115C-105.42. Low-performing local school administrative units; identification; assistance.

- The State Board of Education shall design and implement a procedure to (a) identify low-performing local school administrative units on an annual basis. Low-performing local school administrative units are those in which there is a failure to meet the minimum performance composite score, as defined by the State Board, and a majority of students are performing below grade level.
- The local board of education in a low-performing local school administrative unit may request the State Board to assign a systemwide assistance team to the local school administrative unit to assist the local board in identifying systemwide impediments to student achievement and making recommendations to the board about ways to improve student performance. Upon request, the State Board may assign an assistance team to any low-performing local school administrative unit to assist the local board with the development of a school system improvement plan that contains goals and strategies for improving student performance in the local school administrative unit. The State Board may direct the systemwide assistance team to work with the local board and school personnel to implement the plan and otherwise improve student achievement.
- A local school administrative unit that has been identified as a low-performing local school administrative unit for two consecutive years shall be deemed a continually low-performing local school administrative unit. The State Board may assign a systemwide assistance team to any continually low-performing local

- school administrative unit. When assigned to a continually low-performing local school 1 2 administrative unit, the systemwide assistance team shall: 3 Review and investigate all facets of school system operations and (1) 4 assist in developing recommendations for improving student 5 performance in that local school administrative unit. 6 (2) As deemed necessary by the systemwide assistance team, evaluate any 7 central office or school-based administrators. 8 Collaborate with the staffs of the local board, central office, and local (3) 9 schools to design, implement and monitor a plan that, if fully 10 implemented, can reasonably be expected to alleviate identified problems and improve student performance in the local school 11 12 administrative unit. 13 (4) Make continuing recommendations as the plan is developed and 14 implemented. 15 (5) Review the progress of the local school administrative unit. Report, as appropriate, to the local board, the community, and the State 16 (6) 17 Board on the local school administrative unit's progress under the 18 plan. 19 (d) If a continually low-performing local school administrative unit fails to 20 improve student performance after assistance is provided under subsection (c) of this 21 section, the assistance team may recommend that the assistance continue to that local school administrative unit or that the State Board take further action under G.S. 22 115C-105.39(c)(3). 23 24 The State Board may direct the Department of Public Instruction staff to (e) provide support to a systemwide assistance team. 25 The State Board shall annually review the progress made in identified 26 low-performing local school administrative units." 27 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-105-39(c) reads as rewritten: 28 29 The State Board may appoint an interim superintendent in a local school administrative unit: 30 31 Upon the identification of more than half the schools in that unit as (1) 32 low-performing under G.S. 115C-105.37; or G.S. 115C-105.37; 33
 - Upon the recommendation from an assistance team assigned to a (2)
 - school located in that unit that has been identified as low-performing under G.S. 115C-105.37. This recommendation shall be based upon a finding that the superintendent has failed to cooperate with the assistance team or has otherwise hindered that school's ability to improve.improve; or
 - Upon the recommendation from a systemwide assistance team (3) assigned to a continually low-performing local school administrative unit under G.S. 115C-105.42. This recommendation shall be based upon a finding that the superintendent has failed to cooperate with the assistance team or has otherwise hindered the local school administrative unit's ability to improve.

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The State Board may assign any of the powers and duties of the local superintendent and the local finance officer to the interim superintendent that the Board considers are necessary or appropriate to improve student performance in the local school administrative unit. The interim superintendent shall perform all of these assigned powers and duties. The State Board of Education may terminate the contract of any local superintendent entered into on or after July 1, 1996, when it appoints an interim superintendent. The Administrative Procedure Act shall apply to that decision. Neither party to that contract is entitled to damages."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
