10	BEDS FOR THE PURPOSES OF CERTIFICATE OF NEED REQUIREMENTS.
11	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
12	SECTION 1. G.S. 131E-176(5a) reads as rewritten:
13	"(5a) "Chemical dependency treatment facility" means a public or private
14	facility, or unit in a facility, which is engaged in providing 24-hour a
15	day treatment for chemical dependency or substance abuse. This
16	treatment may include detoxification, administration of a therapeutic
17	regimen for the treatment of chemically dependent or substance
18	abusing persons and related services. The facility or unit may be:
19	a. A unit within a general hospital or an attached or freestanding
20	unit of a general hospital licensed under Article 5, Chapter
21	131E, of the General Statutes,
22	b. A unit within a psychiatric hospital or an attached or
23	freestanding unit of a psychiatric hospital licensed under Article
24	1A of General Statutes Chapter 122 or Article 2 of General
25	Statutes Chapter 122C,
26	c. A freestanding facility specializing in treatment of persons who
27	are substance abusers or chemically dependent licensed under

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1	Article 1A of General Statutes Chapter 122 or Article 2 of
2	General Statutes Chapter 122C; and may be identified as
3	"chemical dependency, substance abuse, alcoholism, or drug
4	abuse treatment units," "residential chemical dependency,
5	substance abuse, alcoholism or drug abuse facilities," "social
6	setting detoxification facilities" and "medical detoxification
7	facilities," or by other names if the purpose is to provide
8	treatment of chemically dependent or substance abusing
9	persons, but shall not include social setting detoxification
10	facilities, medical detoxification facilities, halfway houses or
11	recovery farms."
12	SECTION 2. G.S. 131E-176(5b) reads as rewritten:
13	"(5b) "Chemical dependency treatment beds" means beds that are licensed
14	for detoxification or for the inpatient treatment of chemical
15	dependency. Residential treatment beds for the treatment of chemical
16	dependency or substance abuse are chemical dependency treatment
17	beds. Chemical dependency treatment beds shall not include beds
18	licensed for detoxification."
19	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
