1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE BOARD OF
3	EXAMINERS FOR ENGINEERS AND SURVEYORS TO ACQUIRE REAL
4	PROPERTY, TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT AND LIABILITY INSURANCE,
5	AND TO INCREASE THE CIVIL PENALTY FROM TWO THOUSAND
6	DOLLARS TO FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE
7	NORTH CAROLINA ENGINEERING AND LAND SURVEYING ACT AND
8	CLARIFYING THE REINSTATEMENT REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE ACT.
9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	SECTION 1. G.S. 89C-10 is amended by adding the following new
11	subsections to read:
12	"(i) The Board shall have the power to acquire, hold, rent, encumber, alienate,
13	and otherwise deal with real property in the same manner as a private person or
14	corporation, subject only to approval of the Governor and the Council of State as to the
15	acquisition, rental, encumbering, leasing, and sale of real property. Collateral pledged
16	by the Board for an encumbrance is limited to the assets, income, and revenues of the
17	Board.
18	(j) The Board may purchase, rent, or lease equipment and supplies and purchase
19	liability insurance or other insurance to cover the activities of the Board, its operations,
20	or its employees."
21	SECTION 2. G.S. 89C-21(c) reads as rewritten:
22	"(c) The Board may levy a civil penalty not in excess of two thousand dollars
23	(\$2,000) five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for any engineer or land surveyor who violates
24	any of the provisions of subdivisions (1) through (4) of subsection (a) of this section.
25	The clear proceeds of all civil penalties collected by the Board, including civil penalties
26	collected pursuant to G.S. 89C-22(c), shall be remitted to the Civil Penalty and
27	Forfeiture Fund in accordance with G.S. 115C-457.2."
28	SECTION 3. G.S. 89C-17 reads as rewritten:
29	"§ 89C-17. Expirations and renewals of certificates.

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Certificates for licensure of corporations and business firms that engage in the 1 2 practice of engineering or land surveying shall expire on the last day of the month of 3 June following their issuance or renewal and shall become invalid on that date unless renewed. All other certificates for licensure shall expire on the last day of the month of 4 5 December next following their issuance or renewal, and shall become invalid on that 6 date unless renewed. When necessary to protect the public health, safety, or welfare, the 7 Board shall require any evidence necessary to establish the continuing competency of 8 engineers and land surveyors as a condition of renewal of licenses. When the Board is 9 satisfied as to the continuing competency of an applicant, it shall issue a renewal of the 10 certificate upon payment by the applicant of a fee fixed by the Board but not to exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00). The secretary of the Board shall notify by mail every 11 12 person licensed under this Chapter of the date of expiration of the certificate, the amount of the fee required for its renewal for one year, and any requirement as to 13 14 evidence of continued competency. The notice shall be mailed at least one month in 15 advance of the expiration date of the certificate. Renewal shall be effected at any time 16 during the month immediately following the month of expiration, by payment to the 17 secretary of the Board of a renewal fee, as determined by the Board, which shall not 18 exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00). Failure on the part of any registrant-licensee to renew the certificate annually in the month immediately following the month of 19 20 expiration, as required above, shall deprive the registrant-licensee of the right to practice 21 until renewal has been effected. Renewal may be effected at any time during the first 12 months immediately following its invalidation by payment of the established renewal 22 23 fee and a late penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100.00).reinstatement of the license. The 24 license may be reinstated at any time during the first 12 months immediately following the date the license became invalid by payment of a reinstatement fee of one hundred 25 dollars (\$100.00) in addition to the established renewal fee. Failure of a licensee to 26 27 renew reinstate the license for a period of 12 months during the first 12 months immediately following the date the license became invalid shall require the individual, 28 29 prior to resuming practice in North Carolina, to submit an application on the prescribed 30 form, and to meet all other requirements for licensure as set forth in Chapter 89C. The secretary of the Board is instructed to remove from the official roster of engineers and 31 32 land surveyors the names of all licensees who have not effected their renewal by the 33 first day of the month immediately following the renewal period. The Board may adopt rules to provide for renewals in distress or hardship cases due to military service, 34 35 prolonged illness, or prolonged absence from the State, where the applicant for renewal demonstrates to the Board that the applicant has maintained active knowledge and 36 professional status as an engineer or land surveyor, as the case may be. It shall be the 37 38 responsibility of each licensee to inform the Board promptly concerning change in 39 address. A licensee may request and be granted inactive status. No inactive licensee may practice in this State unless otherwise exempted in this Chapter. A licensee granted 40 inactive status shall pay annual renewal fees but shall not be subject to annual 41 42 continuing professional competency requirements. A licensee granted inactive status may return to active status by meeting all requirements of the Board, including 43 demonstration of continuing professional competency as a condition of reinstatement." 44

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SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
