8	(d) The Department of Administration, the Office of State Personnel, the						
9 10	Department of Transportation, and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall jointly develop and periodically update a plan to reduce vehicle miles						
10		Resources shall jointly develop and periodically update a plan to reduce vehicle miles raveled by State employees and vehicle emissions resulting from job-related travel,

23	employees and employers, carpooling, vanpooling, public transportation, and other						
24	appropriate strategies. The Department of Transportation shall report on the						
25	development and implementation of the plan to the Joint Legislative Transportation						
26	Oversight Committee and the Environmental Review Commission on or before 1						
27	October of e	ach year beginning 1 Oct	ober 2000.				

The Office of State Personnel shall implement a policy that promotes 1 (f)telework/telecommuting for State employees as recommended by the report of the State 2 3 Auditor entitled "Establishing a Formal Telework/Telecommuting Program for State 4 Employees" and dated October 1997. It shall be the goal of the State to reduce State employee vehicle miles traveled in commuting by twenty percent (20%) without 5 6 reducing total work hours or productivity. The Office of State Personnel shall report on 7 progress in implementing this section to the Environmental Review Commission on or 8 before 1 October of each year beginning 1 October 2000."

9 **SECTION 3.** The primary investigator or researcher for the Neuse River 10 Modeling and Monitoring Project shall provide a final report summarizing the findings 11 and outcomes of the Project to the Environmental Review Commission no later than 1 12 November 2005.

SECTION 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective 1 December 2005.
Sections 2 through 4 of this act become effective when it becomes law.
