A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

3 AND PLACE AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS	IN CERTAIN
4 PUBLIC PLACES, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE HEART DI	ISEASE AND
5 STROKE PREVENTION TASK FORCE.	

Whereas, sudden cardiac arrest kills approximately six hundred thousand 6 7 individuals every year in the United States; and

8 Whereas, Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) offer the opportunity for 9 lifesaving therapy to be given to individuals suffering cardiac arrest; and

10 Whereas, response time is critical, ten minutes or less, when someone is in 11 cardiac arrest, thereby making it imperative that AEDs be placed in high pedestrian traffic public areas where they are easily accessible; Now, therefore, 12

13 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

14 SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of 15 16 seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of six 17 thousand dollars (\$6,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year. These funds shall be used to pilot the placement of one Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in each of six public 18 buildings or places where public usage is 300,000 or more visitors per year and the 19 building or place does not currently have an operational AED in place. In selecting 20 pilot sites, the Department shall ensure geographic representation of the State. 21

22 Funds shall be used to purchase six AED units, conduct on-site training at six 23 sites, and conduct ongoing educational/awareness campaigns to the general public in the piloted counties. The Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention Branch of the Division of 24 25 Public Health will be responsible for the purchase of AEDs, training of pilot program participants, and evaluation of the pilot program. The Department shall report on the 26 location, establishment and implementation of the pilot sites to the House of 27 Representatives Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, the 28

- 2 Research Division on or before March 1, 2006.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
