| 9  | <b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-157(f) reads as rewritten:                                    |
| 10 | "§ 20-157. Approach of law enforcement, fire department or rescue squad vehicles        |
| 11 | or ambulances; driving over fire hose or blocking fire-fighting                         |

| 17     | (b) Nothing in this section shall permit a municipality or a county to impose   |
| 18     | restrictions or prohibitions on the activities of any of the following persons who are  |
| 19     | engaged in construction or maintenance, or in making traffic or engineering surveys:  |
| 20     | (1) Licensees, employees, or contractors of the Department of   |
| 21     | Transportation.   |
