The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1.(a) Commission Established. – There is established and search of the House of Representatives and Speaker of the House of Representatives. SECTION 1.(b) Duties of Commission. – The Commission following matters related to expanding rail service in North Carolina: (1) The cost and benefits of expanding and upgrading rails state, including the effect the expanded service economic development. (2) The feasibility, cost, and benefits of establishing comming in the State to transport workers to cities from including the effect the commuter service would have the economic opportunities of those who live in the outh of the cost and benefits of expanding passenger rail western and eastern areas of the State, including expanded service would have on tourism. (4) Ways to preserve unused or abandoned rail corridor needs. (5) Tax incentives for rail improvements to spur economic further expansion and improvements of railroads, lines.

Any vacancy on the Commission shall be filled by the appointing authority. Cochairs of the Commission shall be designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate from among their respective appointees. The Commission shall meet upon the call of the cochairs. A quorum of the Commission shall be nine members.

SECTION 1.(c) Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.

SECTION 1.(d) Staff. – Adequate staff shall be provided to the Commission by the Legislative Services Office.

SECTION 1.(e) Consultants. – The Commission may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.

SECTION 1.(f) Cooperation. – The Commission may call upon any department, agency, institution, or officer of the State or any political subdivision thereof for facilities, data, or other assistance.

SECTION 1.(g) Meetings During Legislative Session. – The Commission may meet during a regular or extra session of the General Assembly, subject to approval of the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

SECTION 1.(h) Meeting Location. – The Commission shall meet at various locations around the State in order to promote greater public participation in its deliberations. The Legislative Services Commission shall grant adequate meeting space to the Commission in the State Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.

SECTION 1.(i) Report. – The Commission shall make a final report of its findings and recommendations to the 2009 General Assembly. Upon the filing of its final report, the Commission shall terminate.

SECTION 1.(j) Appropriation. – Of the funds appropriated to the General Assembly, the Legislative Services Commission shall allocate funds for the expenses of the Commission.

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
