6	SECTION 1. G.S. 120-123(62) reads as rewritten:				
7	"(62) The Northeastern North Carolina Regional Economic Development

24	SECTION 3. G.S. 158-8.2 reads as rewritten:

27	(a) There is created the Northeastern North Carolina Regional Economic				
28	Development CommissionNorth Carolina's Northeast Commission to facilitate				
29	economic development in Beaufort, Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates,

1	Halifax, Hertford, Hyde, Martin, Northampton, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and			
2	Washington Counties, and any other county assigned to the Commission by the			
3	Department of Commerce as authorized by law. The Commission shall be located			
4	administratively in the Department of Commerce but shall exercise its statutory powers			
5	and duties independently of the Department of Commerce. Funds appropriated for the			
6	Commission by the General Assembly shall be disbursed directly to the Commission at			
7	the beginning of each fiscal year.			
8	(b) The Commission shall consist of 18 appointed members and one ex officio			
9	member, as provided below. Each appointed member shall be an experienced business			
10	person who resides for most of the year in one or more of the counties that are members			
11	of the Commission.			
12	(1) Six members shall be appointed by the Governor.			
13	(2) Six members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the			
14	recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in			
15	accordance with G.S. 120-121.			
16	(3) Six members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the			
17	recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in			
18	accordance with G.S. 120-121.			
19	(4) The Secretary of Commerce, or a designee.			
20	(5) Repealed by Session Laws 1999-237, s. 16.6(a).			
21	Any person appointed to the Commission who is also a county commissioner may			
22	hold that office in addition to the offices permitted by G.S. 128-1.1. The appointing			
23	authorities are encouraged to discuss and coordinate their appointments in an effort to			
24	ensure as many counties served by the Commission are represented among the			
25	membership of the Commission.			
26	(c) All members shall serve staggered two-year terms ending on June 30			
27	biennially.			
28	(d) Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Commission shall be for the balance			
29	of the unexpired term. Vacancies in appointments made by the General Assembly shall			
30	be in accordance with G.S. 120-122.			
31	(d1) The initial meeting shall be called by the Secretary of the Department of			
32	Commerce. The Commission shall meet no less than quarterly.			
33	(e) The Commission shall elect annually from among its membership a			
34	four-member executive committee consisting of a chair, a vice-chair, a secretary, and a			
35	treasurer. Members shall serve one-year terms on the executive committee. The			
36	executive committee shall meet no less than quarterly.			
37	(f) In addition to the powers and duties granted to economic development			
38	commissions in this Article, the Northeastern North Carolina Regional Economic			
39	Development-North Carolina's Northeast Commission shall:			
40	(1) Adopt and implement an economic development program, with the			
41	assistance of the economic development advisory board, as follows:			
42	a. Survey northeastern North Carolina and determine the assets,			
43	liabilities, and resources that the region contributes to the			
44	economic development process;

3	с.	Develop and evaluate alternatives for northeastern North

18	(g) Within the l	imits of funds available, the Commission may hire and fix the		
19	compensation of any personnel necessary to its operations, contract with consultants for			
20	any services as it may require, and contract with the State of North Carolina or the			
21	federal government, or any agency or department thereof, for any services as may be			
22	provided by those agencies. The Commission shall hire an employee to serve as			
23	president and chief executive officer. The Commission may carry out the provisions of			
24	any contracts it may enter.			
25	Within the limits of funds available, the Commission may lease, rent, purchase, or			
26	otherwise obtain suitable quarters and office space for its staff, and may lease, rent, or			
27	purchase necessary furniture, fixtures, and other equipment.			
28	(h) Members of the Commission who are State employees shall receive travel			
29	expenses as provided in G.S. 138-6. Other Commission members shall receive per diem			
30	of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) a day for each day of service when the Commission			
31	meets and shall be reimbursed for travel and subsistence as provided in G.S. 138-5."
