4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 131E-159 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
6	"(h) An individual who is required under Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the General
7	Statutes to register as a sex offender shall not be granted EMS credentials and shall not have
8	the person's EMS credentials renewed."
9	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
