4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. Section 9(a) of Part IV of Chapter 908 of the 1983 Session Laws, as
6	amended by Chapters 821 and 922 of the 1989 Session Laws, Section 2 of S.L. 2001-402,
7	Section 1 of S.L. 2011-160, and Section 69 of S.L. 2012-194, reads as rewritten:
8	"Sec. 9.(a) Distribution and Use of Proceeds. – The local administrative authority, acting
9	on its own behalf or as agent for each taxing entity, shall distribute the proceeds of the taxes
10	levied in this Part as provided in this subsection. The distribution shall be made by the 20th day
10	of each month following the month in which the tax is collected.
12	of each month following the month in which the tax is confected.
12	(2) Distribution to Charlotte for Convention Center Facilities. – After deducting
14	the amount provided above, the local administrative authority shall transfer
15	an amount equal to three percent (3%) of the gross occupancy receipts and
16	the entire net proceeds of the prepared food and beverage tax to the City of
10	Charlotte. The net proceeds transferred to the City of Charlotte pursuant to
18	this subdivision shall be applied in accordance with the following priorities.
19	No application of any net proceeds to any class of the priorities set forth
20	below in this subdivision shall be made until, with respect to each preceding
21	class of priorities, either all payments for the current fiscal year have been
22	provided for in full or no such payments are required for the current fiscal
23	year.

25	<u>d.</u> <u>To pay costs of constructing, renovating, and maintaining stadiums,</u>
26	ballparks, and other similar public places that have a seating capacity
27	of 60,000 or more and that are used for professional sporting events.
28	e. To pay costs of constructing, renovating, and maintaining amateur
29	sports facilities, including ancillary, associated facilities, located in
30	the City of Charlotte.

32	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
