2 AN ACT TO REPEAL PERSONAL EDUCATION PLANS AND MODIFY TRANSITION 3 PLANS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5

SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-105.41 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 115C-105.41. Students who have been placed at risk of academic failure; personal 7 education plans; transition teams failure and transition plans.

8 In order to implement Part 1A of Article 8 of this Chapter, local school (a) 9 administrative units shall identify students who are at risk for academic failure and who are not 10 successfully progressing toward grade promotion and graduation, beginning in kindergarten. 11 Identification shall occur as early as can reasonably be done and can be based on grades, 12 observations, diagnostic and formative assessments, State assessments, and other factors, 13 including reading on grade level, that impact student performance that teachers and 14 administrators consider appropriate, without having to await the results of end-of-grade or end-of-course tests. No later than the end of the first quarter, or after a teacher has had up to 15 nine weeks of instructional time with a student, a personal education plan for academic 16 17 improvement with focused intervention and performance benchmarks shall be developed or updated for any student at risk of academic failure who is not performing at least at grade level, 18 19 as identified by the State end of grade test and other factors noted above. Focused instructional supports and services, reading interventions, and accelerated activities should include 20 evidence-based practices that meet the needs of students and may include coaching, mentoring, 21 22 tutoring, summer school, Saturday school, and extended days. Local school administrative units 23 shall provide these activities free of charge to students. Local school administrative units shall 24 also provide transportation free of charge to all students for whom transportation is necessary 25 for participation in these activities.

26 Local school administrative units shall give notice of the personal education plan and a 27 copy of the personal education plan to the student's parent or guardian. Parents should be 28 included in the implementation and ongoing review of personal education plans. If a student's 29 school report card provides all the information required in a personal education plan, then no 30 further personal education plan is mandated for the student.

No cause of action for monetary damages shall arise from the failure to provide or 31 32 implement a personal education plan under this section.

33 (b)Local boards of education shall adopt and implement rules that direct school 34 improvement teams to considerplans for the creation of transition teams and transition plans for students at risk, as defined by the State Board of Education, Education. These transition plans 35



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1	are to assist them at risk students in making a successful transition between the e			
2	school an	school and middle school years and between the middle school and high school years.		
3		SECTION 2. G.S. 115C-83.7(c) reads as rewritten:		
4	"(c)	The superintendent shall determine whether a student may be	exempt from	
5	mandator	andatory retention on the basis of a good cause exemption. The following steps shall be taken		
6		in making the determination:		
7	· · ·	(1) The teacher of a student eligible for a good cause exemptio	n shall submit	
8		documentation of the relevant exemption and evidence that pr		
9		student is appropriate based on the student's academic		
10		principal. Such evidence shall be limited to the student's pers	onal education	
11		plan, individual education program, if applicable, alternative	assessment, or	
12		student reading portfolio.

19		SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-83.9(a) reads as rewritten:		
20	"(a)	Parents or guardians shall be notified in writing, and in a timely manual mathematical statements of the statement of the sta	anner, that the	
21	student shall be retained, unless he or she is exempt from mandatory retention for good cause,			
22	if the stu	dent is not demonstrating reading proficiency by the end of third gra	de. Parents or	
23	guardians shall receive this notice when a kindergarten, first, second, or third grade student (i)			
24	is demonstrating difficulty with reading development; or (ii) is not reading at grade level; or			
25	(iii) has a personal education plan under G.S. 115C-105.41.level."
