10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
11	SECTION 1. The Joint Legislative Committee on Local Government shall study		
12	the development of a process to remove personal information of nonelected officials from		
13	records available on Internet Web sites maintained by cities and counties. In conducting the		
14	study, the Committee shall consider the following:		
15	(1) The nonelected officials, including law enforcement personnel, prosecutors,		
16	and judicial officers, who may request removal of their personal information.		
17	(2) The city and county Web sites from which nonelected officials may request		
18	removal of their personal information.		
19	(3) The information subject to removal from Web sites.		
20	(4) The process for removal of personal information from Web sites.		
21	(5) Under what circumstances the information removed from Web sites is		
22	subject to disclosure as a public record.		
23	(6) The costs of such a process to cities and counties.		
24	(7) Any other matters that the Committee deems relevant.		
25	SECTION 2. In conducting the study required by this act, the Joint Legislative		
26	Committee on Local Government shall consult with any other agencies, institutions, or		
27	individuals that it deems appropriate.		
28	SECTION 3. The Joint Legislative Committee on Local Government shall report its findings and maximum dations, together with any maximum dad legislation, to the 2016

30 31	SECTION 4. G.S. 132-1.7 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
32	"(b1) Public records, as defined in G.S. 132-1, shall not include mobile telephone

34	(1) A sworn law enforcement officer or nonsworn employee of a public law		
35	enforcement agency.
