10	SECTION 1. G.S. 116-280 reads as rewritten:

13	(1)	Academic year. – A period of time in which a student is expected to complete			
14		the equivalent of at least two semesters' or three quarters' academic work.			
15	(2)	Authority The State Education Assistance Authority created by Article 23			
16		of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes.			
17	(3)	Eligible private postsecondary institution A school that is any of the			
18		following:			
19		a. A nonprofit postsecondary educational institution with a main			
20		permanent campus located in this State that is not owned or operated			
21		by the State of North Carolina or by an agency or political subdivision			
22		of the State or by any combination thereof that satisfies all of the			
23		following:			
24		1. Is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and			
25		Schools under the standards of the College Delegate Assembly			
26		of the Association or by the New England Association of			
27		Schools and Colleges through its Commission on Institutions			
28		of Higher Education.			
29		2. Awards a postsecondary degree as defined in G.S. 116-15.			
30		b. A postsecondary institution owned or operated by a hospital authority			
31		as defined in G.S. 131E-16(14) or school of nursing affiliated with a			
32		nonprofit postsecondary educational institution as defined in			
33		sub-subdivision a. of this subsection.			
34	(4)	Main permanent campus A campus owned by the eligible private			
35		postsecondary institution that provides permanent on premises housing, food			
36		services, and classrooms with full-time faculty members and administration
