#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO MODERNIZE THE SYMBOL OF ACCESS FOR PERSONS WITH 3 DISABILITIES.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 SECTION 1. Design Symbol. – The Department of Administration, in consultation 6 with any other State agency or department it deems necessary to consult with, shall design a 7 new symbol of access for signs and other materials indicating access for, or use by, persons 8 with disabilities. The symbol required under this section shall depict a logo with a dynamic 9 character leaning forward with a sense of movement, be readily identifiable, and be simply 10 designed with no secondary meaning. The symbol required under this section shall signify 11 equivalent facilitation and accessibility as the International Symbol of Access.

SECTION 2. Signs in State Buildings. – The Department of Administration shall ensure that all signs in State buildings indicating access for persons with disabilities reflect the symbol of access designed under Section 1 of this act instead of the International Symbol of Access. The requirement of this section only applies to signs installed or replaced on or after January 1, 2018.
