- Ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) to the Department of Environmental 1 (5) 2 Quality, Division of Marine Fisheries to be used for commercial fishing 3 assistance. 4 Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to the Department of (6) 5 Environmental Quality, Division of Coastal Management to be used for the 6 nonfederal match to funding provided through the Emergency Watershed 7 Protection (EWP) Program administered by the Natural Resources 8 Conservation Service of the United States Department of Agriculture for the 9 removal of marine debris deposited along the shorelines of state-owned lands. If the Division of Coastal Management does not receive EWP funding, this 10 11 allocation shall be used as provided in Section 5.12 of S.L. 2018-136.   - One million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the Judicial Department for the (9) replacement of equipment and supplies, contractual services, and additional travel and personnel costs for additional court sessions required as a result of disaster-related courthouse closures.
