BILL SUMMARY:

S380. ENCOURAGE HIGH SCHOOLERS TO ATTEND CCS. (March 23, 2017)

AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO ATTEND THEIR LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGES FOR ACADEMIC OR VOCATIONAL CLASSES.

This bill encourages eligible high school students to attend their local community colleges for academic or vocational classes in accordance with G.S. 115D-20(4), which authorizes colleges to offer certain courses to high school students.

Applies beginning with the 2017-18 school year.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

G.S. 115D-20(4) authorizes community colleges to offer certain courses to eligible high school students. These courses are authorized to be offered on a self-supporting basis or to have tuition and fees waived. Because the bill merely encourages eligible students to attend these courses and does not require attendance, there is no reliable means to estimate an impact on enrollment or an associated fiscal impact to the State for the cost of providing any resulting increased instruction. Therefore, no estimate is available.
