5	Whereas, the health, well-being, and educational success of public school students in			
6 7	North Carolina are top priorities of the General Assembly; and Whereas, employing school nurses has been shown to have a critical and positive			
8	impact on the health, well-being, and educational success of public school students in			
9	kindergarten through grade 12 due to services directed toward keeping students healthy, in class,			
10	and ready to learn; and			
11	Whereas, since January 2013, 17,212 North Carolinians have died from opioid or			
12	fentanyl involved emergencies, an illicit drug that does not discriminate, killing innocent people			
13	in all settings in all 100 counties; and			
14	Whereas, having life-saving naloxone easily available in public schools will save			
15	lives; Now, therefore,

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## **General Assembly Of North Carolina** 1 The governing body of each public school unit shall provide for a supply of (a) 2 emergency naloxone nasal spray on school property for use by trained school personnel to 3 provide emergency medical aid to persons suffering from an opioid or fentanyl emergency during 4 the school day and at school-sponsored events on school property. Each school shall store in a 5 secure, but unlocked and easily accessible location, a minimum of two boxes of 8 milligram 6 naloxone containing a total of at least four nasal spray doses. For purposes of this section, "school 7 property" does not include transportation to or from school. 8 For the purposes of this section, "naloxone nasal spray" means a disposable drug (b) 9 delivery system that disperses a solution of opioid antagonist into the respiratory system through 10 the nose to provide rapid, critical first aid for persons suffering a potentially fatal opioid or 11 fentanyl emergency. 12 The principal of each school in a public school unit shall designate one or more school (c) personnel, as part of the medical care program under G.S. 115C-375.1, to receive initial and 13 14

annual retraining from a school nurse or qualified representative of the local health department 15 regarding the storage and emergency use of naloxone nasal spray. Notwithstanding any other 16 provision of law to the contrary, the school nurse or other designated school personnel who has 17 received training under this subsection shall obtain a non-patient specific prescription for 18 naloxone nasal spray from a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner of the local 19 health department serving the area in which the school is located.

- 20 (d) The principal of each school in a public school unit shall collaborate with appropriate 21 school personnel to develop an emergency action plan for the use of naloxone nasal spray in an 22 emergency. The plan shall include at least the following components:
  - Standards and procedures for the storage and emergency use of naloxone nasal (1)spray by trained school personnel.
    - Training of school personnel in recognizing symptoms of an opioid or fentanyl (2)emergency.
    - Emergency follow-up procedures, including calling emergency services and (3)contacting a student's parent and physician.
    - Instruction and certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. (4)

30 A governing body of a public school unit; its members, employees, designees, agents, (e) or volunteers; and a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner of the local health 31 department shall not be liable in civil damages to any party for any act authorized by this section 32 33 or for any omission relating to that act unless that act or omission amounts to gross negligence, 34 wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing."

35 **SECTION 2.(b)** There is appropriated from the Opioid Abatement Reserve to the 36 Department of Public Instruction the sum of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) in 37 nonrecurring funds for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be allocated to public school units for the 38 purchase of an initial school supply of naloxone nasal spray and to facilitate the training required 39 by this section.

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## 41 PART III. MISCELLANEOUS

42 SECTION 3.(a) Funds appropriated pursuant to this act shall supplement and not 43 supplant any funds from any source already provided for the same purposes.

44 SECTION 3.(b) This act becomes effective July 1, 2024, and applies beginning with 45 the 2024-2025 school year.

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
